# Arshad Abdulla- 1946-2009 <br> by Moyena Niazi (Arch 1996) 

This year the alumni mourn the loss of Architect Arshad Abdulla, a founder of the Indus Valley School and a teacher and mentor to all of us who had the privilege of his acquaintance. As a student, like all others I was in awe of his indepth knowledge, professional experience and perfectionism. We proudly walked for The Kidney Centre, raising funds for a cause. I learnt that if we ask someone to donate for a cause we are actually giving them something; "The opportunity to do a good deed." After graduating, working at Arcop, I learnt that he had envisioned a School of Art and Architecture for Karachi years before it actually materialized. A vision to have a school of excellence that will produce better human beings, an island in the turbulent ocean of current times. Over the years I saw his commitment to The Citizens Foundation and its tremendous success. I discovered that he designed major hospitals in the public sector as a philanthropist. I knew that my mentor is a renowned well reputed Architect, recipient of various prestigious awards. I knew that he is committed to his profession, served with exemplary sincerity as President for the Pakistan Institute of Architects and Pakistan Council of Architects and Town Planners. He always continued to inspire with his dedication to discipline, his principles, commitment to help the under privileged, willingness to guide his students, leadership qualities and humility. Having known all that, it seems strange that his demise led to discovering even more.

At a gathering organized by the PCATP and IAP to honour his memory, his attributes described by many led me to realise his contribution to a generation of architects and related professions. He had actually influenced the lives of so many...friends, colleagues, students and employees. Akeel Bilgrami elaborated on his sincerity, selflessness, humaneness, values, vision, professional principles and his persistent commitment. Ejaz Ahed spoke of his commitment to his principles which led to achievement of all his aspirations in a short lifespan: Pakistans tallest building, an art school for his city and schools to educate the poor. Samar Khan and Tariq Qaiser were grateful for his contribution to their professional and personal life, claiming that he had profound influence on the architects that were fortunate to have worked with him.
