



### URAAN: a flight to freedom

After having gone through the rigorous program of Architecture at the Indus Valley (and having survived it), I immediately realized that I had changed forever. It is not easy to become an architect. Having to look at everything through the eye glass of analyses and critique, I am now perpetually at odds with everything! The formal schooling system, the teachers, and the students – just to name a few. That is one of the reason why I went to teach 17 year olds in a local A level school. I wanted to give them the 'awakening' I received at 22. It wasn't an easy job – but it was rewarding to see that even through the mist of teenage crises, the individual at 17 or 18 is ready to grow.





Growth – I believe it to be the greatest need of the hour. The lack of it has rather made our society, our systems and the individuals who comprise of them – all corrupt and inept. I find it ridiculous when well-to-do families feel they can't marry their daughters without throwing in a bed-set and sometimes even a car. I find it contemptible when parents and teachers ask their students to behave in a manner they find right, and think in the manner they prescribe. I find it heart-wrenching when people habitually abuse politicians and blame them for everything, although they enjoy every luxury of life.

In the event of recognizing that the country is in bad shape my only humble perspective remains, and I want to share it with you; that there is only one solution to address all prevalent problems. The society, the systems and the individuals all need to change themselves, through their own proactive consciousness. Not only is this a very difficult task, it is also something that people will never admit. Self- criticism and Self-development remain the most dormant behaviors in the fabric of our belief system. Everyone wants a revolution in the country but no one wants to revolutionize their own lives. And simply because it takes up a lot of energy and it requires immersing oneself in a lot of unwanted agony.

As the Leader of URAAN – a youth movement – I can only say that the most difficult solution is the most sustainable and useful solution. Until and unless the mindset of the people doesn't change, no will, no law, no political correctness and no revolution can change the derelict hypocritical state of our society. I have learnt this fact after challenging it for a year and I know what I am saying.

To the community of artists and designers: I extend my message and I am open to critique, discussion and team work – that unless we walk the talk, there is no use of being young and full of ideas. Unless we can steer a collective effort to enable a mass movement of growth and self-development, we would have compromised our artistic skills. Unless we can unify our strengths our weakness will divide us even further.



Participation in other recent shows include 'Starring the artist '(March 09) and 'Ishq Vishq' (Oct 09) at The Zahoor Ul Akhlaq Gallery. 'Dear Diary' at The Poppy Seed Gallery (Nov 09), The 2<sup>nd</sup> Alumni Art Collective (Dec 09) and 'Young Blood' (March 2010), Canvas Gallery. Also selected for the Fulbright Scholarship program she leaves for the US this year to pursue her Masters in painting and is currently preparing for her first solo exhibition.


