FOUNDATION YEAR & ALUMNI COLLABORATION





The Karachi City Orientation classes are an activity based series of seminars, structured to help a Foundation Program student examine and re-examine his/her role and relationship with the city of Karachi. The flexible structure of the class evolves with the changing social atmosphere of the city, (and the country as a whole) allowing the content to be concurrent with contemporary social and cultural practices. Essentially, this class is a stepping stone for the students to address greater issues and social dilemmas pertaining to their own cultural identity in the context of the city and its visual culture.

A strange electricity in the air of late, as young people have started taking ownership of this city and are rewriting its recent dark narrative, has led to the theme of this year - RECLAIM.

Keeping the Reclaim theme centre of each class, in 2015 we had many interesting things happen such as creating awareness videos with the students, a drama workshop with the famous Improve group "Platoon", planting 100 trees in a public school in Malir, going to the old Bambino Cinema and watching a 1960's Pakistani Blockbuster (Armaan), an IVS styled Sports Day (which has become a recurrent feature over the years), and last but not least, for the first time ever, we did an IVS CITY O HACKATHON where the students were given 5 genres (Health, Culture, Education, Civic Facilities and Sports) and they had to identify societal problems and come up with creative solutions for them and eventually pitch it to two social media gurus. One group was declared a winner and they get to develop this campaign under the mentorship of experts like Faisal Kapadia and Faizan Leghari.

Sabeen founded Peace Niche, a not-for-profit NGO to promote democratic discourse and conflict resolution through intellectual and cultural engagement. Committed to making it a vibrant centre of Pakistan's developing civil society, Sabeen fearlessly championed many causes including domestic violence and was the brains behind Pakistan's first hackathon. Tragically, she was shot earlier this year after a divisive talk at T2F, the first project of Peace Niche.

This year, she was named one of 100 Leading Global Thinkers by Foreign Policy while her PeaceNiche was nominated for a leading humanitarian award, Human Rights Tulip. Sabeen was also awarded South Asian Meeto Memorial Award in October 2015.



Recently named the new director at Peace Niche is *Alumna Marvi Mazhar AR 2009*, an architect by profession and an artist and storyteller at heart, passionate about the documentation, preservation and restoration of heritage sites in Sindh. She has to her credit a rich portfolio of projects she has worked on, including the conservation of Karachi's Railway Station. We wish her the very best in her brand new role!

A group of artists and volunteers are reclaiming the walls by painting them with cheerful designs aimed at bringing some happiness and pride back to an often violent, chaotic and corrupt city. One of the project coordinators *Alumna Adeela Suleman FA 1999* said she was delighted the work had brought a "less hostile" look.

With help from the city authorities to get the permission they need, they aim to repaint walls in 1,600 different places - from warehouses to schools to flyovers and underpasses.





In 2013, Mariam relocated to London and began work as Gallery Manager at Edge of Arabia. After hosting a number of successful exhibitions locally and internationally, she realized that the traditional gallery model was no longer valid and with Bahaar she aims to bridge this gap by connecting emerging artists from South Asia and the Middle East with young collectors globally.

The film set against beautifully surreal Baluchistan and the chaotic cityscape of Karachi. It took over two years to shoot with Production design & Art Direction proving to be particularly challenging during the Baluchistan spell given the low temperatures of -15 Degrees and poor infrastructure. The production design treatment stuck to using earthy tones and textures in an urban, decayed fashion, with splashes of railway colors; greys, maroons, antique blues and greens.

Fawad Suhail Abbasi, AR 2002 won the Design Excellence Honorable Mention in April 2015 for a residential project in Islamabad from the Institute of Architects, Pakistan (IAP) after winning the IAP Design Excellence Award in 2009.

He currently holds the position of the first Chairman ACYA, ARCASIA Committee on Young Architects for 2015-2016.





Alumnus Ahsan Qureshi CD 2003 is based in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, where he works as a full time photographer and Art Administrator. In 2015, Ahsan launched 'Travel Photographer Asia' an international photography Festival. which aims to provide an umbrella platform for all photography enthusiast.

In its inaugural year, **TPA** was able to receive more than 2600 entries from 86 different nationalities.
