





During their year-long fellowship, this third cohort of fellows will leverage their collective brain trust to explore opportunities for greater collaborative endeavors in redressing the region's common challenges. Alumna Madiha Raza TEX 2009's 'Flight of Birds' collection at the Maybelline New York Millennial Fashion 2014 was original, polished and artistic. Based on leather laser cutting and 3D textures combined with digital printing, 'Flight of Birds' scored on multiple levels. The silhouettes, detailing and finishing of the outfits were all outstanding. Raza's leather cut leather capes were particularly appealing, as were her custom-made, colourful accessories. The vibrant textural handbags and shoes worked perfectly with the collection and were beautiful pieces in themselves.



Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS) required an Aquatic center on-campus with a FINA standard 25m(08 Lanes) swimming pool as a core requirement. The aquatic center will cater for swimming, water polo and other aquatic sports.

We conceived a building that was simultaneously dynamic with exaggerated formal movement and tied seamlessly into the contextual fabric of LUMS. The concept is, hence, about creating a dialogue between the inherent dynamism of aquatic sports and the strict orthogonal geometry of the context.

For this purpose they approached the Pakistan Council of Architects' and Town Planners (PCATP) to organize a nation-wide competition, inviting design firms to submit their proposals. The results of the competition were announced in September and Architects' Bureau (compirsing of the core team of *Alumni Abdul Ali Khan and Saba Shaykh AR 2008* along with Ar. Abdul Qayyum Khan) was declared the winner.

Alumna Rumaisa Mughal CD 2012

recieved a 100% scholarship to Draper University, a 2 month Entrepreneurship program in Silicon Valley. In October 2014 she designed Remote Interview which won first prize at the P@SHA ICT Awardsand it has now been nominated for APICTA 2014, the results of which are due any day!


She is currently working on a game for Pakistans first full-length animated feature film.

AKING MUSIC IN TO

From 1st November to 14th November, Alumnus Talha Wynne CD 2007, also known as Tollcrane, traveled to Tokyo to attend the Red Bull Music Academy which is a series of globe trotting musical workshops. 30 selected participants from all spheres of the music industry from vocalists to producers come together each year in a different city for recording sessions, lectures by musical beatniks, collaborations and basically do anything that inspires them creatively. It's every musician's dream playground and Talha became the third Pakistani ever to be selected to attend the academy.

"I was living in Lahore at the time the Red Bull Music Academy Tokyo application was put up online. I had made a 40 minute mix of my tunes and filled up the lengthy 50 questions over the course of 4 weeks as per the requirement of the app. Application submitted and I forgot about it till June 2014. I had moved back to Karachi now and was at a friend's place when the list for successful candidates was announced online. I could not believe I had made the cut, major excitement and humility just took over me and the wait for November was unbearable.

I landed in Tokyo on the 1st of November, the day was overcast and slightly rainy, perfect conditions for my ice-breaker with this gigantic prefecture. I had a performance the very next day so the tourist in me had to wait till all of that was over with. After our orientation the following day I headed to the club where I was supposed to perform. The club was called Origami and on the bill that night was Mathew Jonson and Benji B, people I have looked up to for new music and sounds and it was quite surreal sharing stage with these guys. I opened the show and it went amazing, far beyond my expectations.

In the following two weeks, I collaborated with incredible minds, my fellow participants who came from different parts of the world, went to amazing club nights with acclaimed DJs taking the decks, sat down

for lectures by Ryoji Ikeda, Fatima Al Qadri, the chief engineer of Korg musical instruments Hiroaki Nishijima, Talking Heads, Tony Humphries, Carl Craig and Robert Hood, all these of which have at some point been names in my iTunes or my Soundcloud's favourited playlist.

These 3 weeks were a life changing experience, the things I learnt, the people I met and had the honor and pleasure of working with, is probably a once in a lifetime thing. Tokyo really is a fantastic city, the balance between structure and nature is in constant equilibrium, much like the conscientiousness and courtesy within every citizen of Tokyo. I owe this journey to all my friends and fellow musicians who stuck together even though the gigs didn't pay, and our albums were being downloaded for free, if you stick to something that feels right,

keep on going and the reward will come by in some way or the other, just don't seek a reward in the first place."

CONFERENCE: THE RIGHT TO WORLD HERITAGE

Last month I attended a very interesting conference at the Bradenburg Technical University in Cottbus. The Title of the Conference was 'The Right to (World) Heritage' and it was a collaboration between the BTU Cottbus, International Association of World Heritage Professionals (IAWHP) and DAAD.

The papers in the conference raised important questions about the political role of heritage and the various political and identity related issues that are a part of the heritage management and representation. Important questions raised during the process of heritage conservation like what to conserve and preserve and what to not preserve must be endlessly discussed and spoken about at all levels from students, civil society to political bodies and authorities. These questions highlight what is important enough about the history and culture of a place

Minority representation and diversification of heritage were essential issues where nationalization processes tend to overlook the diversification of a people or nation in order to make a simplified representation of a place. Heritage representation for the diverse groupings within a nation can increase the ownership value of a nation. This ofcourse has invaluable advantages including economic, social and cultural value additions.

Questions of sustainable physical and community / social development of places with regards to heritage preservation and various case studies made up for some thoroughly intriguing content for the conference.

A fascinating paper looked at the role of artistic activities in promoting and safeguarding heritage in armed conflict in Syria. This showed art work of some local Syrians of partly destroyed buildings in the conflict reinstating identity and what people related to as their own. Making art out of a negative disempowering act was a brilliant way of giving positive vibes of an intellectual and cultural survival representation of a people. All in all, such international conferences are a good reinforcement of the need and urgency to preserve heritage in different parts of the world, and finding good reasons of doing so.

ADVENTURES IN ART THERAPY: INDIA

As one of the artists in residence for the Gram Art International Artists' Residency Program, part of Khoj International Artists' Association, in June 2014 I spent a week in Paradsinga, a village 56 kilometers from Nagpur engaged with the community through various activities including educating the villagers about environmental issues such as ecology and sanitation.

It is noted that around 2.5 billion people have no luxury of defecating privately and Paradsinga was one place I witnessed to have fallen within that number. Therefore, the determination towards having to educate them through art-therapeutic based activities and puppet making, a human-sized pull puppet was constructed by the collective effort of the village boys. This way, it not only brought the community closer but also proved to be a great success in imparting the knowledge of using a toilet seat, which many did not know how to. Hence, the sculptural piece symbolized as a testimony of a healthy long -term relationship with the community folks.

Because of the warmth that I received from the villagers, I felt compelled to go back. I conducted various creative art therapy workshops that included collaborating with different schools, namely Government Primary School, Government High School, Gurukul High School, and Government Secondary High School, from Paradsinga, Chanda Devi Saraf School and Alag Angle Studio, from Nagpur.

The age group ranged from 5-20 years and the objective of these workshops was to provide a platform to deliver unrestricted expressions, which they do not generally have the means to explore. My experience in teaching these young kids and witnessing their emotional growth had been one of the greatest explorations towards my career. Furthermore, they have carved a rainbow in my heart that resonates planning the next round of workshops for them in the upcoming years.
